2. The said game of Foot ball and all preliminary arrangements incident thereto, shall be conducted under the rules and regulations of The 1910 Walter Camp Official Football Guide.
3. The advertising of said game is to be in charge of the party of the second part and he is hereby empowered to use all legitimate means of advertising, keeping the expense of same within reasonable limits.

6. In case the said game is prevented by rain, the said party of the part agrees to pay to the said party of the part the sum of \$ as a rain guarantee, said payment to be made forthwith. This clause is to be omitted.

7. In case either manager fails to produce his team and play the said game on said date and at said place or breaks any clause in this contract without permission of the other party to this agreement, he shall pay to the manager not in fault the sum of \$ 750.00 as a forfeit within one week of date on which said breach of contract shall occur, and also all expenses incurred in pursuance of this agreement by the team which is not in fault.

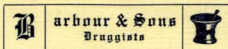



This Agreement, entered into this 31st day of March, 1910, by and between the Transylvania University (Kentucky University) by John Doty, Jr. Manager of the Football team hereinafter designated as the party of the first part, and the UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS ATHLETIC COUNCIL, by H. J. L. Stark, Manager of the Football team hereinafter designated as the party of the second part, stipulates as follows:

1. That the said parties mutually agree to cause their respective Football teams to meet in the city of Austin, Texas on the 23rd day of October, 1910, and then and there engage in a game of Football, said game to be called at 3:30 o'clock p. m.

2. The said game of Football and all preliminary arrangements incident thereto, shall be conducted under the rules and regulations of S. I. A. A.

3. The advertising of said game is to be in charge of the party of the second part and he is hereby empowered to use all legitimate means of advertising, keeping the expense of same within reasonable limits.

4. The financial part of said game shall be under the management of the party of the second part and jointly, and a business settlement under the terms of this contract shall

be had as soon as possible after the close of said game.

5. The said party of the second..... part agrees to pay to the said party of the first..... part the sum of \$ 500.00..... as a guarantee for playing said game, or in lieu thereof as an option, ..... per cent of the gate receipts of said game, said payment to be made immediately after the conclusion of the game.

6. In case the said game is prevented by rain, the said party of the ..... part agrees to pay to the said party of the ..... part the sum of \$..... as a rain guarantee, said payment to be made forthwith. This clause is to be omitted.

7. In case either manager fails to produce his team and play the said game on said date and at said place or breaks any clause in this contract without permission of the other party to this agreement, he shall pay to the manager not in fault the sum of \$ 250.00..... as a forfeit within one week of date on which said breach of contract shall occur, and also all expenses incurred in pursuance of this agreement by the team which is not in fault.
